Static

Background image is correctly positioned on page load, but does not change on scrolling.

No-scroll

Works, but you can't scroll the element.

- The Samsung Android 4 CRASHES on my test page. No data.
- Edge uses a kind-of parallax scrolling that's off.

The background image scrolls with the element (and not the document).

Browser does not support scrollable elements.

Incomplete

Not supported when you also use `-webkit-overflow-scrolling: touch`.





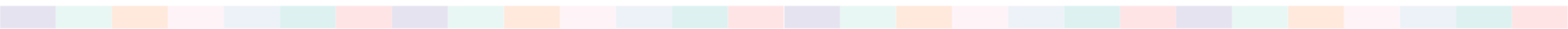

A few Chromium engineers support the project, and we are building the Web Monetization Agent into Chrome together, behind a flag.

What is a Web Monetization Agent?

1. Finds `<link>`
2. Orders payments
3. Fires monetization events

Streaming vs post-paid

Streaming

- Only online
- ✓ → No need to retain payment data
- ✓ → Site owner is paid immediately
- Many requests

Post-paid

- ✓ → Offline and online
- Payment data retained
- Site owner promised to be paid “later”
- ✓ → Few requests

Which model is best? We don't know. So we're letting you pick one.
